The process leading towards such a genuine, positive peace may include, for instance, a stage when a conflict is justified by prevailing injustice; an unprejudiced penetration to the root causes of the conflict; a period when managing the conflict may still be necessary; frank talks about the conflict, its underlying causes and possible solutions; effective problem solving and consensus about a satisfactory solution; implementing and monitoring an appropriate transformation of the conflict; post-conflict reconciliation and reconstruction; and preventing a recurrence of the conflict.
